CONNECT PEOPLE TO NATURE

We want people to recognise that protecting nature can be part of their everyday lives and feel empowered to make changes to reverse the decline in nature's health.

- Partnership with "Trash to Music", a sustainable artist platform which creates musical instruments out of recyclable material
- Creation of a theme song for the park performed by a Casela team member, Gary Legoff and featuring Zulu
- Conducting workshops to foster employee engagement and raise awareness about nature conservation
- Local employment and gender equity (50% women)
- Employees reside in immediate geographic region (60%)
- Partnership with Wecycle, a non-profit organisation which promotes waste separation within the park
